

It's been five years since Dan Simmons started the Cow Moose Sign Project to stop the shooting of antlerless moose in Region 5 and the campaign is continuing to grow and gain momentum.

This past year has seen major growth in the Cow Moose Sign project, with 57, four by eight foot signs purchased in 2019 to 107, and another 710 smaller signs. All in hunting regions the people involved

PATIENT TRAVEL

FROM First Nations Health Authority (FNHA): In response to the changing COVID-19 pandemic environment, Medical Transportation (Patient Travel) benefits have been reinstated

- Medical transportation requests are to be assessed and approved by Patient Travel Clerks (PT) as per normal MT policy
- While some routine health and dental appointments may be available, PT clerks should confirm these appointments with the provider BEFORE arranging travel – so make sure you have contact info (Doctor's #)
- Medical transportation travel requests for urgent appointments no longer need to be submitted to Health Benefits as a benefit exception
- Travel for prenatal confinement, over 5 nights duration, escorts while client is in hospital, etc MUST be submitted as a Benefit Exception
 - Paperwork to support request must be provided
- You may also hand in a letter from doctor's office for reimbursement (make sure it has time, date and doctor's or receptionist signature/stamp on it)
